



Climate Walk 8th - 9th October

Christian Aid is joining with YCCN (Young Christian Climate Network) for a relay across the UK to raise the message of climate justice. The relay began in Cornwall after the G7 Summit in June and will make its way across the UK until it reaches Glasgow, the host city of COP26, in November.

We have the opportunity to be a part of this, by walking and/or making origami prayer boats, which will be carried and passed on to the next group of walkers. I include part of a message from Eirlys Jessop, who is organising a relay from Southport to Liverpool:

'I'm really looking forward to you all joining us on Friday 8th and/or Saturday 9 October for our climate walk. The walk is continuing to grow and has now become an all faith walk. However it will continue to have a definite Christian theme- for us it is a walk of witness covered in prayer finishing at the Cathedral.

FRIDAY 8th OCTOBER

We are going to meet at Christ Church on Lord Street ready to leave by 10am. We will be making our way to St John's Ainsdale, then to Formby, Hightown and finishing at Crosby. If you want to join at any of these stops - here are the times that we will be leaving the venues:

Ainsdale (St John's) 12 midday

Formby (Holy Trinity) 2pm

Hightown (St Stephens) 3:45pm.

We plan to arrive at St Luke's in Crosby around 5:30pm

Some of you will only want to walk one part of the route and some will be keen to walk the whole way to Crosby (approx. 14.5 miles)

SATURDAY 9th OCTOBER

Some of you might want to walk on Saturday from St Luke's in Crosby, who will leave at 10:30am. The walk from Crosby to Liverpool is approx. 7.5 miles. You would be made very welcome. If you want to join the walkers closer to the city they are stopping off at the Quaker Meeting House which is near to Central Station. (we will leave QMH leaving at 2:15pm). Or you might decide to meet at the Cathedral. (please arrive by 2:30pm) I am hoping we can get as many people at the Cathedral as possible where all our prayers will be presented for a blessing before they are sent off to Glasgow where they will form part of a national display.'
