Dear Friends



The Church Council was held on the 27th January, and I share some highlights from the meeting with you.

A written report had been provided on The Way Forward and it was noted that one of the key elements of this, community engagement, is beginning to show new shoots of growth. This is through things such as The Food Pantry and The Bereavement Journey course, as well as existing activities.

From this engagement, we want to be able to offer relevant support to people who may want to explore issues of faith. The Leadership Team will shortly be inviting people from within the church, who may be interested in helping faith seekers to explore Christianity, to a session to discuss how we may be able to offer our gifts and talents.

One of the potential threats to our outreach, and to the life of the church, is our financial situation (as it is with many churches). For ourselves, if income and costs remain as they are, we will see a £13,653 deficit year on year (our reserves are projected to be £54,550 by the year end). Obviously this cannot be sustained. There are a number of actions we are looking to take, such as: 1) Informing you, the congregation, via this letter, so that you can consider if you can respond through giving. 2) Increasing lettings, and we thank Jim Lloyd for his hard work in this regard. 3) Reducing the Assessment (the payment we make to the Methodist Church for ministry and support). 4) Reducing costs generally, noting that our buildings, despite the best endeavours of the Property Team, are expensive, especially given the inflexibility and relative low usage per week of the main Church building. To this end we have invited the Director of Property Support for the Methodist Church to visit us, with a view to conducting a feasibility study for the options for our buildings. More information and consultation on this will follow in due course.

In the meantime, thank you for your contribution to the life of the Church.
