Dear Friends

***How can we be convincing if we are divided?***

I am preparing this letter on the 25th January which is the final day in the Week of Prayer for Christian unity. The stimulus for the week comes from Jesus' words to his disciples.

*'My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. (John Ch 17 vs 20-21)*

If we rely on the national news to inform us about the state of Christian unity then we would probably be disheartened. Taking this week as an example, we have observed the tensions within the Anglican Communion to maintain unity whilst considering the issue of same sex marriage. In any given week the spotlight can fall on any denomination.

As I look at the diaries of the churches I serve, I am struck by the Christian unity that is taking place which years ago may never have been entertained.

In Ainsdale last Sunday, the Methodist Church were delighted to join the congregation of Ainsdale Village Church (itself a Baptist/URC partnership) for our weekly Sunday service. We are sharing two joint services a month on a six month trial basis.

In Scarisbrick, Bescar Lane Methodist Church have been sharing some services for a significant period of time with St Mark's Anglican Church. This week the Church Council at Bescar Lane voted unanimously to write to St Marks to request that we seek to enter a formal partnership arrangement.

In Birkdale this coming Sunday morning, it is the turn of Liverpool Road Methodist Church to host the quarterly joint service to which the parishes of St James, St Johns and St Peters are invited.

When the spirit of unity it is a movement at a local level it is a powerful witness within our communities. May our witness be convincing in its unity.
