Highlights from the Church Council held on 18th January 2023.

Worship Space - Our average Sunday morning attendance is 48, and we are spread across the whole length of the church (many say it's too large a space for the number of people). The Worship Consultation Meeting considered four options:-

- a. No change and continue as we are.
- b. Move the praise group and the preacher forward.
 - c. Have the services in the New Room or Hall.
- d. Have the service in the church but bring the congregation forward.

The Property Committee had previously considered what would be required to make the Hall/New Room more suitable for worship (thanks to Andy Trimble for his paper on this).

The unanimous decision of Council was to invest in soundproofing, sound and loop system (approx. £2250) in the Hall and once this is in place, trial the use of the Hall for 3 months (save for significant services). Improving the sound system will be of benefit to a number of Hall users. At the same time investigate making space at the back of the church (removing pews) to create an area for families with children and to serve refreshments on occasions.

New Office Holders - We immediately require volunteers as Church Stewards, Church Council Secretary and Church Treasurer (a Bookkeeper is to be engaged to undertake the main transactional activities). Without such volunteers we acknowledged our ongoing viability is significantly vulnerable. We discussed how we may reduce the burden upon office holders and churches generally. One way is to have fewer Trustee bodies (i.e. Church Councils), and instead have one Trustee body for the Circuit (i.e. the Circuit Meeting), or merge some Church Councils into a cluster (e.g. one church with multiple locations). The consequence is that the local church loses some autonomy, including being able to determine its existence at a particular location. The benefit is the need of fewer office holders. The unanimous decision of Council was to contact the Circuit and asked them to investigate this across the Circuit. Any proposal would come back to Church Council for approval.
