#### Dear Friends

In this Easter season we now have a few weeks considering the resurrection appearances of Jesus. I always feel sorry for Thomas, dubbed "Doubting Thomas", for in reality all the disciples were doubting to begin with. Why didn't history called Thomas "Courageous Thomas" for when he said to the disciples "let us also go [to Lazarus in Bethany], that we may die with him". The disciples had just counselled Jesus against going because the people there had previously tried to stone him. Poor Thomas.

Resurrection in our human reasoning isn't something we can comprehend, it shouldn't happen, it cannot happen; can it? So when Thomas hears the disciples telling him what they have seen, no wonder he wants to witness it for himself!

Jesus said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe."

Thomas said to him, "My Lord and my God!"

Then Jesus told him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

(John Ch 20 vs 27-29)

So we fall into the category of those who have not seen. We cannot have the experience of Thomas in witnessing the resurrected Jesus, for that we rely on Scripture and its first hand accounts from those who saw with their own eyes. The story affirms to us that Jesus is alive and we worship a supernatural God of resurrection.

How does this play out in our own lives? What is our experience of resurrection? I love the story Jesus told of the Prodigal Son. I imagine the Father felt he had lost his Son when he walked off with his share of the inheritance. For me this is, amongst other things, an example of resurrection power. In this Easter season I encourage us to look back over our lives for where resurrection has taken place, and to pray for those circumstances where resurrection is craved.

For blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.
