Dear Friends

Have you ever been a witness to an incident for which you have had to give evidence. I've been a witness on a few occasions at EmploymentTribunals. One time I was cross examined for over a day. All the parties where taking time to understand the case and get to the truth. In Holy Week we see that for expediency the truth can be manipulated.

Jesus answered Pilate, "The reason I was born and came into the world is to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to me."

"What is truth?" retorted Pilate. (John Ch 18 vs 37b-38a)

"What is truth?" is a question often posed to us, whether it be through news stories (as examples an ex-President or a Royal Prince), or between two squabbling children both with chocolate around their mouths saying they didn't eat the Easter Egg on Good Friday! What is truth; what do we believe?

And so we come to the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, with the good news that there are accounts of what happened. Not just one but by multiple eye witnesses. As written in the book of Acts...

Peter said, "We are witnesses of everything he did in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They killed him by hanging him on a cross, but God raised him from the dead on the third day and caused him to be seen. He was not seen by all the people, but by witnesses whom God had already chosen—by us who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one whom God appointed as judge of the living and the dead." (Acts Ch 10 vs 39-42)

We have not needed to see with our own eyes, rather we have the first hand accounts of those who saw the resurrected Jesus with their own eyes. They witness to the truth.

Alleluia! Christ is risen!

He is risen indeed! Alleluia!
