

Dear Friends



(Extract from The Lord's Prayer)

These words act as an aide-memoire for what we hope for on earth; that it will be like heaven. As we pray the Lord's Prayer it hopefully prompts us as Christians to become enablers of heaven on earth.

And what opens our access to heaven? For me it is grace; the free and unmerited favour of God bestowed upon us all, despite the fact that in our humanness we don't deserve it. In our humannesses we focus on self rather than being selfless. There is no distinction between any of us in this regard...

"...all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Romans Ch 3 vs 23)

So if grace is the key to heaven, for earth to be as it is in heaven, grace must abound in the present; and so it does from God to us, although does it from us to others?

Jesus' story of the Labourers in the Vineyard illustrates what the kingdom of heaven is like. Those hired early in the day have an expectation that those hired later in the day will receive a lower wage. Nah, says Jesus, that's not how it works. Grace does not have a price list like the local chippy where a large portion costs more than a small portion. In the kingdom of heaven unlimited grace is given to all.

"And about five o'clock he [the landowner] went out and found others standing around, and he said to them, 'Why are you standing here idle all day?' They said to him, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You also go into the vineyard."

(Matthew Ch 20 vs 6-7)

There is no limit for the landowner as to how many labourers can be hired. The landowner continuously seeks to welcome all, valuing each the same. I wonder if we pick and choose how much and to whom we offer grace. If so, is it really grace?
