Dear Friends

I happened to be listening to part of the Coronavirus Public
Inquiry this week when Dr Halpern was giving evidence. He led
the Behavioural Insights Team to consider if we, the general
public, would adhere to the government rules regarding Covid regulations.
One of his comments was that we are much more likely to take our lead
from what those around us (friends, family, neighbours, colleagues etc) are
doing rather than relying on written instructions. He reflected that the vast
majority of people complied and positively we followed each others lead.
Ironically, former Deputy Cabinet Secretary Helen MacNamara had given
evidence just before Dr Halpern and stated there wasn't a day in number 10
when the rules had been followed! We have heard the accusation that
those at the centre of government felt above the law, that in some way they
were special.

The set reading for this Sunday is Matthew Ch 23 vs 1-13, and in the NIV it's headed "A Warning Against Hypocrisy". Jesus teaches the crowds and his disciples saying

The teachers of the law and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat. So you must be careful to do everything they tell you. But do not do what they do, for they do not practice what they preach.

I think in his time and place Jesus was head of the Behavioural Insights Team! He understood that people looked far more at what those around them did rather than what they said. Ideally the two should correlate, although we know that far too often they do not. That unfortunately is the case for those around us and for ourselves. Former Local Preacher Ken Hooton told the story of someone who didn't go to church because it was full of hypocrites. Ken's response was that it was because he was a hypocrite that he went to Church; for forgiveness and to learn once again to be humble.

This weeks passage ends with Jesus saying

For those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.
