Dear Friends

I recently went on a guided walk hosted by Ainsdale National Nature Reserve. The Reserve is the piece of land from the costal road at its junction with Pinfold Lane running south to Fishermans Path in Freshfield, and from the railway track running west to the beach. It was a beautiful bright crisp day and people had travelled from around the Mersey region to come and visit what is on our doorstep. One lady had moved to the area from the hills of Yorkshire which she misses, although she has been won over by the grandeur of the vistas she now views each day.

If you are unable to take a walk through Ainsdale woods, then you maybe interested in a recent radio recording from Clare Balding as she discovered them for the first time (you can listen via the following link - https://www.bbc.co.uk/sounds/play/m001rgxv).

What struck me was how much human intervention there has been in the Reserve over hundreds of years. As an example, many of the very large sand dunes on the edge of the beach were made even bigger by the Victorians, who built them up and grassed them so that the land behind could be protected for agriculture use (where today Shetland cattle graze). The pine trees are a relatively new introduction from Mediterranean areas. What seems random, is being carefully and sensitively managed, although nature is always in charge. As an example the sand dunes are forever moving inland and indigenous plants always seem to win out in the end as they reignite the landscape. So it begs the question...who is in charge? Humankind or Mother Nature (i.e. God), or are we seeking to live corroboratively with God, guided by his lead?

Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honour God with your bodies.

(1 Corinthians Ch 6 vs 19-20).
