#### Future Focus

God's kingdom is both here and now, and still unfolding, fully realised only in some future time. It is the realisation of its dual nature that makes facing the future with confidence possible. Scripture paints a picture of what the future might look like in God's time, with God's love, peace, wisdom and justice spread like banners over the whole of creation.

If we truly believe that God is at work in the world, visible in all acts of mercy, active wherever there is goodness and love, consoling whenever there is pain and grief; truly believe that God is God, able to do far more than we can ever imagine (Ephesians 3.20) then, rather than being discouraged by current trying circumstances or threats of global catastrophe, we can choose to live hopefully in and with Christ. We can dream of a kingdom to come, 'a new heaven and a new earth' (Revelation 2I.I-5) in which there will be no more tears or suffering. We can also remember that Jesus told the Pharisees (Luke 17.21): The kingdom of God is among you. 'Among' is sometimes translated 'within', but either way, it's clear that Jesus is talking about the present reality of the kingdom of God, a way of living which can change the world – if we would but live it out day by day.

May this reflection give you some space to discover more of the kingdom of God within you and among you.
